## Regulatory Standards Applicable to COVID-19

- There are NO specific OSHA standards covering COVID-19!
- Current OSHA standards that may be relevant and applicable to the pandemic include:
  - OSHA personal protective equipment (PPE) regulations 29 CFR 1910 Subpart I
  - OSHA standard on comprehensive respiratory protection program 29 CFR 1910.134
  - OSHA General Duty Clause that requires employers to make places of employment to be free from recognized hazards likely to cause death or serious physical harm – Section 5(a)(1) OSH Acts of 1970, 29 USC 654(a)(1)
  - OSHA Blood Borne Pathogens standard 29 CFR 1910.1030
